

In addition to the family estate, the finest blocks of grapes from Santa Barbara and Monterey Counties are selected from vineyards managed by a sister firm, Mesa Vineyard Management, Inc. All wines produced are exclusively farmed by the Merrill's who believe that control from planting and pruning through harvest, fermentation and cellaring is critical for success. It also ensures a uniform dedication to sustainability, which led our recent Certification in the SIP program within the Central Coast Vineyard Team.

The family believes in community and industry involvement. Dana Merrill was the first San Luis Obispo County Chair of the California Association of Wine Grape Growers, a charter member of the pioneering vineyard Sustainability group, the Central Coast Vineyard Team and is a past two-term Director of the Paso Robles Wine Country Alliance.

Questions &Answers







Q: Where and when did you purchase your 8?

I bought my 8er one year ago, fall 2011. I found it from a dealer who deals only with exotics. I gave my '96 SVT Cobra Mustang for trade.

Q: Why did you pick your current 8 over some other?

Here in Finland there isn't very many choices. This one was a good one and well maintained. Full service book and known history. It came from Sweden in 2003. I called the last three owners here in Finland and got the impression of a well kept vehicle.

Q: What made you pick the 8 series over other BMW models?

I'm not actually so much of Bimmer-guy. This is my first BMW. I was looking for a new summer ride, substitute for Mustang. Mustang wasn't really a high end sport car but it sure set the performance requirements high. Other requirements were two door coupe with rear wheel drive and big engine.

Q: What is it about the 8 you enjoy most?

It's a big comfortable coupe. It's nothing like those small ricers. And yes, the look is very beautiful also. This car is at its best when taken on long road trips.

Questions & Answers



Q: What maintenance have you done to your car?

Last winter I made several maintenance works along with some other modifications. After I purchased my 8 I haven't driven it much. I put it in the garage right away for winter. I changed all oils, filters, plugs, etc., and basic stuff like that . A few water hoses, radiator and auxiliary water pump needed replacing. All fuel lines in engine compartment were leaking a bit, so I replaced those. Hardest job was resealing intake manifolds. After that no EML light and rock steady idle. Same time I changed lot of different hoses and ultrasonic washed the injectors. Because this is my summer ride, I installed a cooler 80*C thermostat, colder auxiliary electric fan switch, and external Hayden 8-row oil cooler for the transmission. Then I fabricated my own cat-less front exhaust pipes. Also tested how it sounds when center resonator is deleted. Horrible rattle.







Questions & Answers



Q: I noticed you modified your FTP. What did you do to them?

Only exterior mods are light related. First thing was to update front headlights. Ripped off those original burnt projectors and fitted new Hella 3" D2S bi-xenon projectors into original housings. Now you can really see at night. After that I took off the FTPs and wondered what I'm going to do with those. I removed the amber lenses behind the front clear lens to get the clear smoked look. Then I added one bulb on the side to get US-spec style touch. I always hated that one odd section the on side without any purpose. All this finished with wired original DLR system to work.

Car drives like a champ. It is so amazing to drive a 20 year old car that does not squeak from suspension or rattle from interior panels. Everything works like it came from factory. The only thing that I need to take care of during summer was those notorious capacitors in GM unit, but in the end it was piece of cake.



It was very exciting to get it out of garage at spring. There was a whole lot of work done but not a single clue how things turn out after. This car is very reliable. But after all the work I did during winter, I have now driven the full summer without any problems.

Installed Halogen Projects

Projectors are Hella EvoX-R from The Retro Fit Source. They perform very good compared to original melted and worn out halogen projectors. Bi-xenon feature is very welcome. Magnet solenoid pulls shield away front front of bulb to expose full beam pattern. Installation was quite simple. Only the original leveling system has to go for more room. Other than that, adjusting was the most time consuming task.
